1.	Pam Tuckett welcomed Core Members and all members on the call introduced themselves in turn.

4.	 Practice Update: Amanda provided the group with an update on further recruitment for PCN roles. We are pleased to have now recruited 2 further Social Prescribers and 2 Health & Wellbeing Co-Ordinators meaning each practice in the PCN now has its 'own' on site social prescriber with support being offered by the coordinators. Recruitment for additions to our pharmacy team is ongoing but proving challenging as private pharmacies are able to offer more favourable terms. Dr Tessa Keeler at Riverside & Dr Emma Williams at Towerhouse will be taking maternity leave from September & December respectively. We have successfully recruited cover for Dr Keeler and recruitment for Dr Williams cover is ongoing with some positive options being considered. The lift at Riverside is now installed and fully functional. It is already proving very helpful as we have have to use our upstairs rooms more during the Covid pandemic. The practice still plans to have an official 'opening' when we are able to thank both the League of Friends and Bovey 					

	 Dr Vasquez and Ben gave the group an update on the practices current protocols and procedures during the Covid-19 pandemic and how the team have coped throughout. We are now operating a 'total triage' model for GP appointments, meaning all patients are consulted via telephone or video consultation in the first instance. However any patient that NEEDS to be seen face to face will always be able to do so safely and quickly and this has been the case throughout the pandemic. A more thorough explanation of the practices protocols is available in the latest practice newsletter, kindly produced by Ray. Amanda gave the group a run through of this years flu campaign and how it will be different this year in light of the challenges faced due to Covid-19. This year the practice will be contacting patients to ask them to get in touch, with the first cohort of patients being contacted being over 65 year old patients with long term conditions. The practice will be offering 3 full day Saturday clinics at Riverside as well as a full week of morning flu clinics at Towerhouse in September. The additional cohort of 50-64 year olds will be contacted later in the winter, around November/December to be booked in, vaccine stocks permitting.
